## Kelli Maguire writes:

Teachers asked their students to offer comments on how they think our school is living up to its mission. I think you will hear their love and connection to Guffey School in these interviews.

Evidence that I am in compliance with this policy is as follows:

## From MS 5th-8th grade class:

- How is Guffey School helping? I ask myself that all the time. I feel safe here. Guffey School has always been a safe place for me. I am constantly learning and growing while knowing I have a safe place to talk. Mrs. MacDonald is an amazing person and principal. (8th grader)

- What I like about Guffey School is that there are the right amount of kids with small class sizes. Guffey School is helping me by the teachers helping me individually. The teachers are helping me grow and helping me with the things I struggle with. The meals are great! I always come up for seconds. Guffey is special because we get more privileges. They always check to see if you are okay. I love how we always talk in the mornings. I love the kids here. They are nice and care about everybody in the school. The way they teach here is unique. (5th grader)
- I want to achieve big things and go to college for math and science. Guffey has given me that chance to succeed more than my last school. The teachers are helping me in ways that my old school would never even think about. I get to express myself with photography. I can push myself more. Guffey helps me with my dyslexia and dysgraphia. At my old school they pushed it away and let me struggle. In Guffey I can be me. The people in Guffey are so strong. Even when Mrs. Sardi had to quit, they powered through it. I love to be surrounded by people like that. (5th grader)
- I like that I get to learn at my own pace. I'm in 5th grade, yet I'm working at 8th grade level. Guffey School is helping me academically. I would never be able to learn as well at other schools. Guffey School is special to me because I have been here since 2018. The teachers are

They help me learn new things like handwriting, spelling, grammar, and a lot more. Guffey School helps me grow. Guffey School is special because it is better than all the other schools I've been to. - I love Guffey School! I like Guffey School because of Mrs. MacDonald. Mrs. MacDonald helps me with math and reading. Guffey is an amazing school. It helps me think I can do anything. I like the food. I also like being in the winter program. (3rd grader)
- I like Guffey School because it has so much cool stuff like a playground. Guffey School helps me by learning math, reading, art, science, and social studies. Guffey School is special to me because teachers help me. Teachers are so fun because they are awesome. I love the food! (2nd grader)
- My old school yelled at me when I was small. This school does not yell at me. I don't like being yelled at. It makes me cry. I like Guffey so much. (2nd grade)

Evidence that I am in compliance with this policy is as follows:

As this is my first year in this position (8 years total working here), I have been mindful of all the traditional ways GCCS has always included the community. All the major Holiday events (thus far) have value added to the school and community. The traditions continued with The Bakery, Mountain Aries Market, the Guffey Fire Station, the 4 Mile Fire Station, the Library, Victor/ Cripple Creek American Legion, and our newest traditions, Wild Spirit Mountain Lodge (Halloween party and games), The Ugly Sweater Guffey Tree Lighting Ceremony, numerous community members joining in and supporting. Additionally, these events brought in the community and future GCCS students.

In addition, reaching out to community members and developing relationships with businesses, locals, and the fire department. CPR/ First-Aid/AED training for staff and this spring for our middle schoolers. Building on relationships and community connections will also create a possibility of new events and sustainability for our students here at GCCS. Last, we have two opportunities for Yoga (on Friday and Sundays) at GCCS. And as always our amazing volunteers who are dedicated to supporting our students weekly with reading, math and our middle school electives along with Zumba Class.

Evidence that I am in compliance with this policy is as follows:

I have not done anything that would put our school at risk or allow activities that are against the law, unethical or unsafe, are disrespectful, imprudent, or in violation of our school's governance policies. The school has policies that address safety, respect, and legal implications. They are found in the following policies: EL-3-The Board, EL-11-Accomplishment Reporting to the Public, EL-13-Educational Program, EL-16-Student Conduct and Discipline, EL-18-Consideration of Legal Implications and El-19-Physical Safety of Staff and Students. Each of these policies are reported on throughout the school year, in accordance with GP-8, Annual Agenda Planning Calendar.

Our policies are reviewed at least annually, if not more often, or at the very least as-needed. Because our school is a community school with one goal of the school is to reflect our students, families and community, we are able to gather family/ community input when reviewing policies. In years past the school's emergency plan with input from selected community members was revised. For me, as I learn the policies this year, this has led to minor adjustments as to the "how" of the safety policy and has led to explicit definitions of school policies involving students. Through these discussions we were able to

update our policy to meet our current needs and current concerns. This year there have been updates to the emergency evacuation plan, AED and CPR plans (mandatory that we have at least 2 drills), bus and sub/volunteer policies with family and staff input. Those most closely connected to the changes were involved in the process and through valuing input from multiple sources to ensure things like school policies are lawful, ethical, respectful, prudent, and not in violation of charter Board policy or the charter contract.
